This week, aligned to the tactical plans, Sellafield have also updated their guiding principles, to which we are aligned, a summary of the SL guiding principles are:

- *We aim to have all significant work faces open by the end of September and every employee meaningfully engaged in work delivery by the end of August.*
- *We need to make sure we are delivering value*
- *Our workplace is safe - Nuclear Safety remains the overriding priority*
- *The new normal means working flexibly and differently. Managers will determine the most effective way of delivering scope, adhering to the hierarchy of working remotely and off the main site wherever feasible.*

The flexibility to work overtime, is at times necessary to meet the site safety & security requirements. The normal process for approval remains in place in that:

- The work to be undertaken underpins the site requirement
- Alternate arrangements have been considered
- Band 2 sanction is provided

Under C-19 constraints this is further compounded and is being discussed at the numerous return to work POCs etc to ensure that the necessary rigour and approvals are applied via our SO.

This is part of our normal planning process and also underpins our stated ambition to return as many people to work as soon as is safely possible.

We will of course (with our representatives) seek to ensure equality of opportunity as we progress through the return plan.
